FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:



Season of Change

What's the famous quote about weather in Illinois? If you don't like the weather, wait 10 minutes – it will change!

Right now, it seems like changes at Good Shepherd are happening as fast as the proverbial weather outside. The bad news is that transitions and changes can bring upheaval and uncertainty. The good news is that transitions can also bring new people and opportunities.

When Deacon Jason announced his transition to synod staff, the Church Council began a process of listening and praying, considering and planning. We've met with Pr. Amy Zietlow to learn about what a call process might look like. We've talked to some youth directors from other congregations. And we'll be meeting next week to put together some more concrete plans and hopefully even a search committee who will help us find new leadership for Youth and Family ministry here at Good Shepherd. It's important work – work that's asking us to look not just at 2024, but forward to 2030 and beyond. What hopes do we have for youth and families at Good Shepherd? And what talents, skills, and gifts will help bring those hopes to fruition?

We are also facing big transitions in our musical ministry. Fenella's program at the University was discontinued and she and her partner left Champaign to pursue other opportunities elsewhere, leaving us without a choir accompanist. This came shortly after our long-time organist, Linda, announced her upcoming retirement. The Worship and Music Committee decided to pursue hiring one person to fill both the role of choir accompanist and primary worship musician. They've already put together a job description, posted the job in different places, and the search committee is receiving resumes. However, we also know that playing the organ is a dying art. This means that our next primary musician will likely be a keyboardist specializing in piano – not an actual organist. While we're hoping that we will find someone who can play the organ, we're also trying to be realistic, seeking a qualified keyboardist who will lead our singing, accompany the choir, and enhance our worship of God in this place. We've also

asked Julia Hartman, our choir director, to become a full-year employee instead of just the 9 months September through May. Julia's skill with the guitar and voice will enhance and broaden our worship in different ways, and I look forward to her musical leadership in worship alongside Linda this summer.

All of these changes and transitions leave me feeling both excited and apprehensive. Change is hard and finding and welcoming new leadership can be a challenge. However, the gifts people have to share are beautiful. And letting those gifts shine will enhance our life together in ways I can't even imagine at this point.

Plus, as people of faith, we know that God is with us in all of the transitions of life – be they quick weather changes or whole new directions. The God who walks alongside us, who supports and encourages, challenges and guides, is with us in these transitions, too. We can trust that God's Holy Spirit IS at work, helping these processes and searches bear good fruit for the future of ministry at Good Shepherd.

So what can you do in this time of transition?

- 1) Pray. Keep Good Shepherd, the search committees, the Council, and the processes in prayer.
- 2) Support the committees and me. There's extra work to be done right now. Where you can step up or help out, do so. Volunteer your own talents and gifts. If you are musical, help with music. If you value our children's faith, volunteer to help with youth activities or Sunday School.
- 3) Appreciate the work that's being done. Thank Linda and Julia for their ongoing leadership. Support the parents who are coordinating youth events. Encourage our New Orleans chaperones and youth participants.
- 4) Be patient. Our committees and search teams are all volunteers with busy schedules and other concerns. The talent pool of candidates is not enormous. We want to fill these positions, but we also want people who will help us grow into the future. It may take time. And we may have to get creative in the meantime.
- 5) Keep an open mind and heart so that we can welcome whoever and whatever God brings our way. Prepare yourself for more changes and transitions ahead as we welcome new leaders and/or new directions for ministry.



Together, we will weather these changes and transitions. Together, led by God and strengthened by the Holy Spirit, united in purpose in Jesus' name, we will move into the future God is imagining for us. Thank you, as always, for your partnership in the gospel ministry we share. Thank you for your prayers, your support, your appreciation, your patience, and your openness to what God is already doing in our midst.

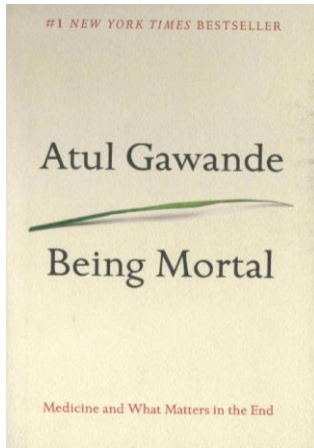

A WEEKLY LOOK INSIDE C-U AT HOME

(A message from the board)

Members of our board gathered for their annual strategic planning retreat. Staff were invited to sit in on the first hour, during which our executive director Melissa Courtwright offered some reflections on the progress we've made as an organization over the past couple of years. Following are some highlights from her presentation.

"C-U at Home has undergone significant transformations in recent years," Melissa reported, "all centered around better serving our clients and community. The

organization has upheld its reputation as a trailblazer, a legacy that began with [founder Melanie Jackson's] visionary establishment of C-U at Home in 2012."

Melissa called the development of our Mid-Barrier and Advanced Shelter models, along with our unique Pathways to Progress program, innovative concepts that "challenged conventional perceptions" of how individuals facing homelessness can experience lasting life transformations.

Milestones achieved since late 2022 include relocating both our women and men's programs from our former congregate shelter site at 70 E. Washington to their current residential locations in the community, seeing 8 individuals make the transition to advanced shelter houses, and celebrating with three clients who have successfully graduated from our program.

"C-U at Home is dedicated to a profound mission: empowering individuals and eradicating chronic homelessness," she concluded. "The unwavering support of our board enables our staff and clients to pursue this noble cause with gratitude. Your ongoing support remains integral to the realization and continuation of this mission."

That last sentence extends to all of you whose ongoing support makes our work possible and allows us to continue impacting lives in meaningful ways.

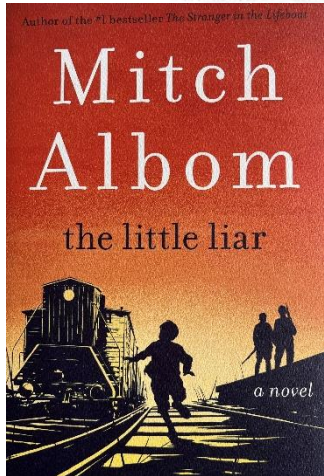

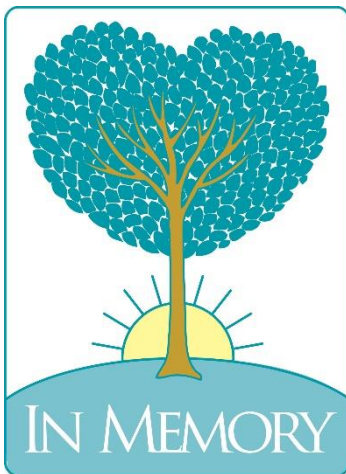

NEW TREES PLANTED IN MEMORY OF LOVED ONES



Three new trees have been planted in the memory of Good Shepherd's heavenly departed members. Two of the trees have been planted on the southeast side of the sanctuary in memory of Tom Holm and Sonja McManaway. A new flowering tree has just been planted in the northwest corner by the fellowship hall to replace the tree that was removed last year. Friends of Karen Loeschen provided funds to purchase the new tree. A tree's life is long, is living and is always giving back life. They are a wonderful tribute that will live on.

We are blessed that those departed were in our midst and grateful their family & friends have chosen to honor their memory by beautifying Good Shepherd.

PROPOSED NEW LANDSCAPING/PATIO



Last year we were the recipients of patio bricks that St. Andrews graciously gave to us when their old building was torn down. These bricks were fairly new, and we moved them to our church for possible use. It is important that we use the gift of the bricks on our property.

The Property Committee approved getting proposals for using the bricks to make a new patio on the southwest side of the sanctuary near Pastor's office that is a perfect shady spot for members and staff to sit to have quiet

time, meditation time, or use for a lunch break. The lowest bidder was Merrill Landscaping (around \$8,000) who provided a lower bid by several thousand and answered specific questions about effects on tree, drainage away from the building, and the need for additional bricks. We are keeping the tree. Merrill has provided a color image of the proposed plan, and it has been placed in the narthex for view by members. The Property Committee is trying to make every effort to reduce the maintenance of the property. We have been fortunate to have a few members who have worked on keeping our property manicured and weeds in the beds under control. We are grateful for their efforts and service in this manner. It is a laborious job to maintain flower beds, and it is important that we continue to make efforts to reduce maintenance.

We will be combining funds from memorial funds, the capital budget, and from any generous contributions of members who have interest in this project to improve outside areas of our property.
