Welcome, Katrina Widholm! In April, Good Shepherd interviewed several candidates for the position of Program Assistant. This position incorporates some of the work that Deacon Jason did with the Discipleship program behind the scenes (like prepping classrooms, managing curriculum, etc.) with some of the work that Marilyn did (like helping to recruit volunteers and helping committees follow through with contacts and contracts) and adds some much-needed expansion of our social media footprint.



Katrina brings creativity, media skills, including website management, and years of experience in education. She is an award-winning artist and arts teacher with degrees in Fine Arts and Graphic Design/Visual Communications and a Masters in Education. Her special interest is in human-centered design. As she writes, "Design can be solely for the purpose of solving a problem... or it can have personal, social, or political significance. As a designer you must balance the two. My philosophy is to produce aesthetically pleasing, user-centered solutions to the design problems that are given to me. I use my creative intellect

as well as my past experiences to influence my work, yet I balance my own specific style aesthetic with a human-centered design process."

As an educator, Katrina is also thoughtful about the classroom experience. For her, the work students do in the classroom is "potentially part of something bigger". She sees the wider impact of what we do to teach young people – whether it's about art or Jesus. She also understands that learning is a life-long process – and again, whether we're talking about God or art creation— that process can be nurtured at all different stages.



Besides her skills in classroom management and in visual design, Katrina also has experience with coordinating events. She has coordinated festivals and workshops, celebrations and conferences. She will bring those skills to our committees to help with the details of some of the events we host each year.

As a bonus, Katrina is also a life-long member of Good Shepherd. She was baptized here as a child and has been involved as a youth and as an adult in various ways. While she doesn't know everyone, and while newer folks may not know her (yet!), Katrina is outgoing and personable and able to connect with a wide spectrum of people. Which means - sometime very soon she might be talking to YOU about helping out with a project or event at Good Shepherd! Because she's planning to expand our social media, she might also be talking to you about being in short videos — answering quick questions about Good Shepherd or your particular ministry here. Whatever she asks, I encourage you to say, "Yes", get involved, and have fun!

Katrina is the daughter of Jack and Sally Widholm and mother of 17-year-old Sofia and currently teaches art at Holy Cross Elementary. She will be continuing that work alongside her work at Good Shepherd.



TABLE TALK PUB THEOLOGY GROUP



HYPERTENSION

"YEAH, IT'S MAY" and many of us will be headed out for more structured exercise, walking etc. I thought it might be a nice time to check the latest from the America Heart Association regarding: What Can Happen when you have diagnosed hypertension and just what can you do to be aware of the harm it can cause the body overtime. Or maybe there is hypertension in your family?

- Heart Attack Your blood vessels can become blocked, preventing blood flow to your heart.
- Stroke The vessels that bring blood to your brain can burst or become blocked.

- 3. <u>Kidney disease</u> Damage to your blood vessels prevent your kidneys from filtering blood properly.
- 4. <u>Heart Disease and Heart Failure</u> When you have high blood pressure, your heart needs to work harder. This can cause serious long-term damage.
- 5. <u>Vision loss</u> The vessels in your eyes can become damaged
- Sexual dysfunction High blood pressure can cause dysfunction in men and women.

TAKE ACTION: It's not all gloom – you have the power to help control these issues by maintaining a healthy blood pressure.

- 1. Regularly check your blood pressure according to your doctors' recommendations or use a monitor at a public place. If you have high blood pressure, it is best to buy a home monitor at any drugstore. Take your pressure regularly. Record and take this to your doctor on your visits.
- 2. Live a heart-healthy lifestyle. Get enough physical activity and eat healthy foods.
- 3. Don't smoke, get plenty of sleep, limit alcohol, and keep stress in check
- 4. Take your medication as prescribed.
