FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:

A Global Village of Saints

On our recent trip to San Diego, we discover a little International Village in Balboa Park. While it doesn't contain houses from every country in the world, there is at least one from every continent and region. Each little house presents their culture, their country, their history, in their own ways. Some do it through food, others through music or art. Some tell their history or address current issues. All of them are hosted by volunteers who have immigrated from that country and who are proud of their culture and heritage.



In several of the houses we visited, the hosts were chatting with visitors in their native language, often comparing where, specifically, their family came from compared to the hosts' family. It was a moment of connection, of coming home, of finding someone with whom to speak your first language, of feeling like you belonged. And I, the monoglot observer, found it beautiful.



As we Christians prepare to observe All Saints' Sunday, this image of a multi-cultural gathering place where differences are celebrated while unity is practiced can become another image for heaven: the saints with whom we will gather around the throne of God will speak many different languages, come from all parts of the globe, and will have diverse ideas of what it means to be home. And yet, at the same time, we will all experience, in that place, in that moment, a sense of connection, of belonging, of coming home.

The diversity of our own community here in Champaign-Urbana can also be a glimpse of that heavenly gathering. The joy a student finds in discovering that they can eat food from home is as wondrous as getting to taste foods from around the world. Both of those things remind us

that we are part of a global community and share the common longing for both the familiar and the new.

I don't know what heaven will be like. The Bible doesn't give us any concrete answers – only some glimpses and ideas and visions. But I'm guessing that God's eternal kin-dom* will be as diverse and beautiful as the church here on earth - with songs and praises in thousands of different languages; with folks greeting one another as though they are long lost kin, and with all of us experiencing both the wonder of something new mingled with the comfort of coming home.



And just as Holy Communion gives us a foretaste of the feast to come – a mere hint of what lies ahead – our diverse communities and diverse hymnody and diverse Church can give us a glimpse of the great variety of saints who will be gathered around the throne of God. There is room for all – at God's table and in God's kingdom. May we practice that at Good Shepherd and in Champaign-Urbana and in every village – international or otherwise – that we enter.






ALL SAINTS' SUNDAY CROSS+GEN GATHERING & BRUNCH







- 10:30am: Delivering lunches.



HEART DISEASE: Did you know 3 out of 4 people will experience a cardiovascular incident after age 70?

The most common age for a heart attack is 65 for a man and 72 for women. Some important points to be aware of, for yourself, a friend or family member.

- 1. KNOW YOUR NUMBERS:** Have your BP, cholesterol and glucose levels checked once a year and let your provider know of any heart disease in your family.
- 2. HIT THE TRAIL:** Regular exercise is very important. A few minutes of walking faster and not just strolling is best. And breathing just a little faster is also good for your lungs.
- 3. DON'T SKIP BREAKFAST:** This is the most important meal of the day. Look for items that have protein and don't forget fruits, juice, milk or yogurt.
- 4. RESEARCH WORTH WATCHING:** More than 2,200 steps per day can help you live longer and gives you lower odds of developing heart disease or dying early a recent study suggests.

5. USE A TRACKER: A watch or step tracker may be a gift to yourself or others. According to the Harvard University Health Watch studies, researchers learned that taking between 8,000-10,000 steps per day lowered the risk of early death by 39% and risk of a heart attack, or stroke by 21%. *"Personally, as your Faith Community Nurse at GSLC, before age 80 I tried the 10,000 step goal and after 80 down to 8,000 goal. Did I make it every day, NO, but you can start with a goal of 2,200 steps."*


